- The total assets of the Foundation were \$1,247,173 (\$1,214,591 in 2014).
- Contributions made to the Foundation totalled \$2,608 (\$6,300 in 2014).
- Net investment income for the year totalled \$124,085 (\$54,532 in 2014).
- Donations made to the YMCA of Greater Moncton Community Initiatives programs totalled \$34,899 (\$27,186 in 2014)
