

Inclusivity

Early childhood is a special time when the seeds of future success are planted. Research has shown that the growth and development of a child during the first six years of their life has more influence on their learning, behaviour, and health into adulthood than at any other time. Yet a traditional classroom environment, while effective for many little learners, may not always adequately address the diverse needs of every child.

The introduction of a multi-sensory room at our YMCA Early Learning Center marked a significant enhancement to our facilities. Since opening March 2023, this innovative space has provided a holistic approach to early childhood development by stimulating multiple senses simultaneously, fostering growth and well-being in a nurturing environment.



"The sensory room has been a positive experience for my son. It is a great space where he can work one-on-one with his behavioral therapists or have a moment of comfort and calm. It's a perfect space to work on his self-regulation in a calm and quiet atmosphere that is not over-stimulating. During his therapy sessions, he loves interacting with the projectors, which helps create opportunities to develop his imagination, problem-solving, and communication skills. This is a fantastic resource for the children at the centre as well as the community. I know many children will benefit from it, as my son has."

Belonging

Meet Bernard LaPointe, a resilient soul who has been a cherished member of the YMCA for the past decade. His journey with us began after a life-changing accident eleven years ago left him permanently injured. But instead of letting it define him, Bernard chose resilience and optimism.

After a year of rehabilitation, Bernard decided to focus on swimming and became a member of our YMCA community. As time went on, he ventured into other sports like badminton and engaged in various programs and personal training sessions. Although he explored other gyms due to sponsorships and curiosity, Bernard always found himself returning to the Y.

Reflecting on his experience, Bernard remarked, "I realize how much I like the people, the way I've been treated is different here. It's less pressured and people are super nice." He found the YMCA to be devoid of social pressures, with accessibility to equipment and the helpfulness of our staff.

Despite the challenges he faced, Bernard's positive attitude and determination propelled him forward. He described the Y as "authentic

and like a soft pillow" a place where he felt comfortable and accepted, unlike other gyms where curious eyes often lingered. Embracing his new reality, Bernard focused on his abilities rather than dwelling on what was lost.

Bernard's resilience and achievements have inspired many and have sparked motivational talks about his life and journey. He encourages others facing adversity to focus on self-improvement and positivity, urging them to "start focusing on yourself, practice self-help, and focus on the positive things."

Last year, Bernard's dedication and skill brought him home the Para Badminton WH2 Singles Bronze from the Parapan American Games in Santiago, Chile. His story serves as a beacon of hope and inspiration, showcasing the transformative power of determination and community support.


